BILL NO.	TITLE of BILL	ACTION
<b>SENATE 1</b>	<b>Banning the Sale of E-Cigarettes (Health and Human Services)</b> This legislation prohibits the sale, or distribution of any products as defined in the Pennsylvania Consolidated statutes to those age 25 or younger.	
<b>SENATE 2</b>	<b>Recreational Use of Marijuana (Health and Human Services)</b> This bill would allow for the recreational use of marijuana for individuals 21 years of age or older.	
<b>SENATE 3</b>	<b>Parental Consent to Join Online Networks (Law and Justice)</b> A bill prohibiting those under the age of 18 from joining social media without parental consent and defines privacy rights that minors have on social media.	
<b>SENATE 4</b>	<b>Unauthorized Use of Electronic Tracking Device (Law and Justice)</b> An act providing the offense of unauthorized use of an electronic tracking device; and providing for penalties.	
<b>SENATE 5</b>	<b>Four Day School Week (Education)</b> An act providing for four-day school weeks and an optional enrichment day.	
<b>SENATE 6</b>	<b>K-12 School Day Start (Education)</b> And act providing that all Pennsylvania elementary and secondary public schools may not begin class before 9:00AM.	
<b>SENATE 7</b>	<b>Voter Identification to Vote (State Government)</b> An Act stating that a qualified elector shall provide a valid identification at each election.	
<b>SENATE 8</b>	<b>Repeal Closed Primaries (State Government)</b> An Act amending the Pennsylvania Election Code to allow those who are registered as an independent voter to vote in a primary election.	
<b>SENATE 9</b>	<b>Mileage-Based User Fee (Transportation)</b> This bill will require the State Department of Transportation to impose either a mileage-based fee or an annual fee that would apply to Pennsylvania drivers of plug-in hybrid vehicles and electric vehicles.	
<b>SENATE 10</b>	<b>Raising the Driving Age (Transportation)</b> A bill raising the driving age for Pennsylvania residents from the current requirement of sixteen years of age, to eighteen years of age.
